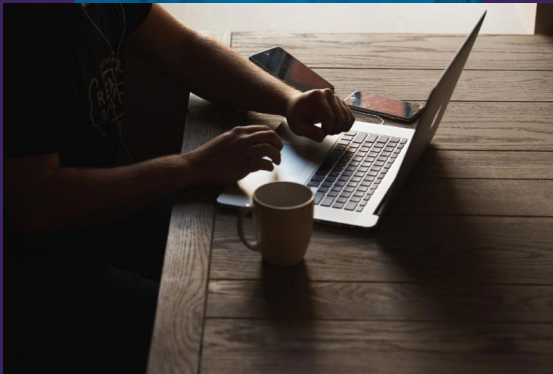

Most of you will recall that in preparation for our Diamond Jubilee this year, the 75 Fund was established to help sustain and further NSAL's ability to support

young talent in the arts. Through your dedication to the organization's mission and goals, we have been able to provide substantial assistance to young artists for 75 years. With your continued support, NSAL can look forward to celebrating another 75 years.

The 75 Fund provides resources for scholarships, sponsorships, and for showcasing our classical voice and 2-D art competition winners at our Annual Meetings. It allows us to sponsor talented young writers at the Iowa Young Writers' Studio. Through our partnership with the prestigious School of the Art Institute of Chicago, we have been able to award our first Kathy Morgan Lee and Audrey Peery Scholarships for artists between the ages of 23 and 30. At our Annual Meetings in 2016, 2017 and 2018, recipients of the Winston Visual Arts Scholarship exhibited their award-winning artwork. The Winston Classical Voice Scholarship recipients have been able to perform at the Annual Meeting each year. In 2017, the winner of the new Dorothy Lincoln Smith Voice Competition was able to perform at the Presidents' Luncheon at the Annual Meeting in Boca Raton. Growing the 75 Fund will make it possible for us to add more programs of this type. By helping a talented young person to advance his or her goals in the arts, we underscore our commitment to supporting the arts — so critical to culture and a civilized society.



The 75 Fund helps us increase NSAL's visibility and impact in the national arts community. At our 75th Anniversary in Washington, DC, we will premiere three short promotional videos. They are Part One of our marketing effort currently underway, designed to broaden NSAL's sphere of influence as a supporter of emerging artists. We must evolve with the times by reaching young artists through 21st-century communication tools such as social media and other online platforms. The videos we are creating are the gateway. They will be living documents telling the story of NSAL and the artists we serve. As we continue to add new promotional videos each year, we believe we will drive more visitors to our national and chapter websites. As a result, we will have the opportunity to reach more young artists, increase membership, attract donors and sponsors, and raise awareness of NSAL on the larger stage.
